

Summary of University Midwestern State University

History

Since its founding in 1922, Midwestern State University has grown from a local junior college to a regional state university serving a wide and varied public. Created in 1922 as Wichita Falls Junior College, the second municipal junior college in Texas, its earliest home was in Wichita Falls High School with which it shared both the building and faculty. Later, a legislative act and a vote of the people of Wichita Falls set up a separate tax district to support the junior college. In 1937, the college acquired a new, forty-acre campus of its own on the south side of town. Rising above pastures and wheat fields was the recently finished Hardin Building, an impressive Spanish colonial structure which was presided over by a lofty bell tower. Also in that year the college was renamed Hardin Junior College in honor of Mr. and Mrs. John G. Hardin. During World War II, the establishment of Sheppard Field, later renamed Sheppard Air Force Base, added to the college's public. Since that time, air base personnel and their families have been continuing participants in the campus academic programs. The post World War II years brought more change in the school's mission and in its name. In 1946, the senior college division was added and accordingly the name was altered to Hardin College. In January 1950, the name changed to Midwestern University, the junior college division remaining Hardin Junior College. In these years, wider recognition came to the school. In March 1948, the University became a member of the Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. In January 1959, the University added a Graduate School which received full approval from the State Board of Education in August of that year. A further change in the school's status came September 1, 1961, when by action of the 56th Legislature of the State of Texas, Midwestern University became part of the Texas Colleges and Universities System and the junior college division was dissolved. In 1975, the Texas Legislature changed the name to Midwestern State University. From its beginnings as a municipal junior college housed in a high school building, Midwestern has become a state university whose campus of 179 acres and 48 buildings offers a wide variety of academic programs in liberal and fine arts, mathematics, sciences, business, and applied sciences. Midwestern is also a prominent member of the Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges (COPLAC). Consumer Digest magazine has recently named Midwestern State University number one in best value for public colleges and universities in the country.

Accreditation

Midwestern State University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award associate, baccalaureate, and master's degrees. MSU's three largest academic programs include business, health sciences, and humanities and social sciences.

Summary of Business School Dillard College of Business Administration








The Dillard College of Business Administration is housed in a new 88,000 sq. ft. modern facility that opened in August 2006. It is comprised of 985 undergraduates and 49 MBA students. Majors offered in the school include accounting, economics, finance, general business, management, marketing, and management information systems. Dillard College is currently accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs and is working towards AACSB International accreditation. Midwestern started its business undergrad program in 1946 and started its MBA program in 1959. In 2006 Midwestern's College of Business Administration moved from the Fowler Building to its current home in the Dillard Building. At the same time, the name of the business college was changed to the Dillard College of Business Administration in honor of A.R. Dillard Jr., and the Dillard family for their generous donations to Midwestern State University. In early 2007 Dillard College of Business made a partnership with Perot Systems that provides employment opportunities and scholarships, among other things, for business students.

Colony History

In the beginning

The idea of bringing a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi to Midwestern State University started in the fall of 2006 when the colony's first adviser, Barbra Hargrove, had the desire to create a business association on campus that would be open for all business majors. A couple of interested students started researching national business organizations and found Delta Sigma Pi to be the best one out there. To make it better, Midwestern had a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi that became inactive in the 1960s. There was an organization interest meeting on October 3, 2006. The Dean of the Dillard College of Business Administration, Dr. Chelte, signed our Chapter Reactivation form on October 24, 2006 and gave us a generous \$500 donation from the college to get us started financially. We also held our first elections on that day with Thomas Deasy III becoming the first President and Mark Wernette the first Sr. Vice President. On October 31, 2006 we officially established a colony at Midwestern State University with the intent of petitioning the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi for a chapter charter. We had nine members and choose the Greek letters of Nu Epsilon Zeta

February 13, 2007 – (S) Valentines Dance

Our colony held a Valentines dance social that was open to the entire school. It was a great tool to let the university know what Delta Sigma Pi was and to recruit new members. We were also able to collect canned goods as part of admission into the dance for the local community food bank.

February 6, 2007 – (PA) Information on Volunteering at the Boys and Girls Club A director for the Wichita Falls Boys and Girls Club came and talked to us about certain programs they offer and how the club is ran. We had ten members attend.

March 2-4, 2007 - LEAD

Our colony sent Thomas Deasy III to the St. Louis LEAD as our representative.

March 20, 2007 - (PA) Boys and Girls Club Tour

A director for the Wichita Falls Boys and Girls Club took us on a tour of the different locations of the Boys and Girls Clubs in the Wichita Falls area. We were able to see the behind the scenes running of the clubs. We had eleven members attend.

April 12, 2007 - (SA) Striech Family Lecture

The Striech Family Lecture is an annual event at Midwestern that brings in a guest speaker to give a lecture on free enterprise. This year's lecture was presented by Walt Pavlo who was head of the accounts receivable department for MCI and later spent jail time for his involvement with the MCI-WorldCom scandal. He talked about ethics and white-collar crimes. Our colony helped usher the event. We had eight members attend the event.

April 19, 2007 – (PA) Financial Adviser

A financial and investment adviser from the Wichita Falls community came and talked to our colony about job opportunities in the field of Finance and the current trends in investing. We had ten members and one guest attend.

April 25, 2007 - (SA) Food Bank

Our colony went and worked at the local food bank in Wichita Falls. We worked in their warehouse organizing different foods to be passed out. We had eight members and two guests attend.

May 18-20, 2007 – Beavers Bend State park

Our colony sent four members on our regional leadership retreat to Beavers Bend State Park in Broken Bow, Oklahoma. We all had a lot of fun and learned a lot about teamwork, leadership, and more about how Delta Sigma Pi works.

June 26, 2007 – (F) Car Wash

Our colony held a car wash to raise money. We made a lot of money by selling car wash tickets to individuals before the day of the Car Wash. This helped insure that we would have customers and we made most of our money this way.

August 2007 - Grand Chapter Congress

Thomas Deasy III went to Grand Chapter Congress in Orlando Florida as our colony's representative.

September 4-14, 2007 - Recruitment

For two weeks our colony spent a lot of time doing recruitment. We set up a booth in the Dillard College of Business building. We also had activities that included information sessions, an activities night, ultimate Frisbee, and a movie night. We just about doubled in size during this time.

September 12, 2007 – (PA) Sherwin Williams

Rick Ouellette and R. Matt Schupp who work for Sherwin Williams came and talked to us about the company and the employment and internship opportunities they offer. There were twelve members and three guests who attended the event.

October 12, 2007 – (S) Put-Put and Buffalo's

Our colony along with some Delta Sigma Pi alumni went and played put-put and had dinner together. Everybody had a lot of fun and members were able to learn more about the national fraternity. It was a great bonding and networking experience.

October 14, 2007 - (SA) Light the Night

Our colony participated in Light the Night Walk which promoted awareness for leukemia and cancer patients. We also held a car wash where we raised over \$300 for the cause. There were sixteen members who attended the walk.

October 19, 2007 - (S) Cardboard Boat Race

Our colony participated in the annual homecoming cardboard boat race held at Midwestern. Our members pitched in to build a boat and race it. Although we did not win, it was a great bonding activity and a good way for our colony to participate with other university organizations.

October 25, 2007 - (PA) Dining Etiquette Course

Barbara Hargrove, who works for Midwestern and was a faculty advisor for us, gave an etiquette course for our colony. We were able to learn proper business etiquette for most situations. There were twenty-three members in attendance.

October 27, 2007 – (S) Halloween Party

Our colony had a Halloween party where members were able to socialize. Everybody came in costume and there was a costume contest.

October 26 & 31, 2007 – (SA) Boys and Girls Club Haunted House

Our colony helped out the Boys and Girls Club of Wichita Falls by working in their haunted house during Halloween. Our members were able to have fun by dressing up in scary costumes while helping the community at the same time. There were a total of twenty-two members who helped out on the two work days.

November 1, 2007 - (PA) Dentist Speaker

Dr. Brian Hasse, a local dentist who owns his own dental practice in the Wichita Falls area came and talked to us about the field of dentistry, owning and operating your own business, and entrepreneurial skills. There were twenty-one members at the activity.

November 2-4, 2007 - Houston LEAD

Our colony sent thirteen members to the Houston LEAD. It was a great networking and educational experience. It also created even more dedication to the colony for the members who were able to attend.

November 3, 2007 - (SA) Toys for Tots

Our members collected toys and brought them to the Houston Lead to give to the Toys for Tots organization. There were seventeen members who participated.

November 7, 2007 - (S) Centennial Dinner

Our colony held a Delta Sigma Pi centennial dinner at the Pelican, a local restaurant. We were even able to have some alumni from our university's old chapter attend.

November 8, 2007 - (PA) Small Business Development Center

L.O. Nelson, who works for the Small Business Development Center located at Midwestern, came and talked to us about how they assist small businesses and about owning your own small business. There were nineteen members who attended.

November 9, 2007 - (SA) Food Drive

Our colony ran a food drive to benefit the local food bank in Wichita Falls. Our members passed out bags to houses for people to fill up with canned goods and returned to collect them a week later. We also had a drop box on campus. The drive was part of an area wide drive and our colony was one of the largest contributors. We had twenty-eight members participate.

November 10, 2007 – (SA) Humane Society

Over the course of the semester our members volunteered at the Wichita Falls Humane Society on Saturdays. Some of the activities included cleaning and walking the animals. There were nineteen members who helped out there.

November 15, 2007 - (SA) Food Bank

Our colony went and worked at the local food bank in Wichita Falls. We worked in their warehouse organizing different foods to be passed out. We had twenty members attend.

November 16, 2007 – (F) Car Hop

Our colony car hopped at a local Sonic in Wichita Falls to raise money for the colony. It consisted of taking orders out to customers and we were allowed to keep all the tips made. We were able to make \$416.

November 19, 2007 - (F) Bake Sale

Our colony held a bake sale fundraiser in Midwestern's student center. Members brought baked goods to sale to raise funds. Our colony brought in about \$75 from this fundraiser.

November 30, 2007 - (S) Christmas Party

Our colony had our own Christmas party. Members socialized around food and punch. There was also a white elephant Christmas gift exchange between the members.

December 5, 2007 - (PA) Resume Building

Karla Landours, who works in the career management center at Midwestern, came and talked to us about how to build a resume and cover letter, what employees are looking for, and how her office can help us in our job search. There were twenty-one members in attendance at the event.

December 9, 2007 - (SA) Adopt-a-Kid

Our members were able to get together and buy Christmas gifts for a child we adopted through the Adopt-a-Kid organization. There were twenty-six members who helped out to buy the child gifts.

January 22 - February 1, 2008 - Recruitment

Our colony spent two weeks doing hard recruitment. We worked an informational booth in both the Dillard College of Business building and Midwestern's student center. Some other activities we did for recruitment were information sessions Jeopardy, game night, mini golf, a breakfast, pizza & pool, and a movie night.

February 2, 2008 - (F) Car Hop

Our colony once again car hopped at a local Sonic in Wichita Falls making about \$550 this time.

February 4, 2008 - (PA) Dr. Patton

Dr. Patton, a recent addition to Midwestern's accounting department and our newest colony faculty advisor, gave a seminar about his life's work and job opportunities in the accounting field.

February 10, 2008 - (S) Ultimate Frisbee

Our colony members played an Ultimate Frisbee game together. It was a great way to socialize and work as a team.





Membership by Graduation Month and Year




