Dr. Quincy Doudna, president of Eastern Illinois University,
Charleston, Illinois, was born in 1907 at Poynette, Wisconsin.
His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Doudna, were public school educators and later operated a dairy farm near Poynette.

President Doudna was educated in the public schools of Poynette and received his Bachelor of Arts (A.B.) degree from Carroll College, Waukesha, Wisconsin, in 1927. He received the Master of Arts (M.A.) degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1930 and the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.) degree from the same institution in 1948. He was awarded the doctor of laws (LL. D.) honorary degree in 1960 by his undergraduate alma mater (Carroll).

During President Doudna's presidency of Eastern the student body has risen to approximately 3,850 students. Major changes in the teacher education program, which remains as the major educational program of the University, have been made to strengthen and broaden the background of Illinois teachers. A unique plan for allowing superior high school students reductions in specific requirements in certain areas if high school work in the same field has been satisfactory has been instituted.

President Doudna is a member of the Charleston Methodist Church and is a member of that church's choir. He belongs to the Charleston Rotary Club and is on the board of directors of the Charleston National Bank.

HISTORY OF EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY

In order to provide more adequate facilities for the training of teachers for the public schools of the state, the General Assembly of Illinois, by an act approved May 22, 1895, established the Eastern Illinois State Normal School.

In response to changing demands, Eastern Illinois State Normal School became, successively, Eastern Illinois State Teachers College (1921), Eastern Illinois State College (1947), and Eastern Illinois University (1957).

In 1907 the power of conferring degrees was granted to the institution by the General Assembly. Courses leading to the degree of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) were announced in 1920. Beginning with the class of 1944 the degree was changed to Bachelor of Science in Education (B.S. in Ed.).

Courses leading to the degree of Master of Science in Education were announced in 1951; the first Master's degrees were conferred in a Summer Commencement, July 31, 1952. The Master's degree was recognized by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools in March, 1953.

In 1954 the Teachers College Board authorized the preparation of curricula leading to the degrees B.A. and B.S. without preparation for teaching. The first degree under this authorization was conferred in June, 1955.

In 1961 the Teachers College Board approved the establishment of curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Arts and Master of Science.

The grounds cover an area of two hundred and thirty-eight acres including the original tract of forty acres which became the campus proper, seventy-two acres purchased in 1931 and named Lincoln Field, and several adjoining parcels purchased in 1946, 1947. and 1957.

A plot of wooded land in Coles County was deeded to the University in 1955 by Mrs. Helen Burgner Douglas of Mattoon in memory of her parents. It is used for nature study by faculty and students.

The campus of Eastern Illinois University now consists of ten educational buildings, two administrative buildings, seven dormitories, the University Union, and the University Apartments for married students, consisting of sixty apartments. Buildings now under construction include a nine-story women's dormitory, an annex to the Life-Science Building, and a new Clinical Services Building.




UNIVERSITY UNION

These residence halls for 450 women students are named for the late Ellen Ford, a former teacher of Laten and Dean of the College, the late Isabel McKinney, formerly Head of the Department of English, and Miss Annie Weller, Emeritus Head of the Department of Geography.



THE MARY J. BOOTH LIBRARY

The University Library offers facilities for study and recreation. About 110,000 books and over 750 current magazines are available for use by students and faculty; in addition, there are approximately 18,000 bound magazines, and extensive picture and pamphlet collections. A browsing room for general reading is provided. The music listening room, with its store of classical and popular records, is open to students on a regular schedule. There are frequent exhigitions of paintings and craft work in the art gallery.

Director of the School of Business

Dr. Giffin received his Ph.D. degree from Northwestern University in 1953. His undergraduate education is comprised of a B. S. in Ed. degree from Eastern Illinois University in 1946, and the M. S. degree from Indiana University in 1947.

From years 1941 to 1946, Dr. Giffin served with the United States Navy. Enlisting in 1941, he was promoted during the war years through the ranks until, at the end of the war, he held the rank of Lieutenant (jg).

Dr. Giffin began his teaching career at Eastern Illinois University in 1947 with the rank of instructor. Since then he has been promoted successively to ranks of assistant professor, associate professor, and professor as he has taught both the management and marketing areas of business. In 1959 he became the department head, and with the organization of the School of Business in 1963, he was named Director of the School of Business.

He is a member of the American Economic Association, National Business Education Association, Illinois Business Education Association, the Academy of Management, the National Education Association, the Illinois Education Association. He is a member of Pi Omega Pi and Delta Pi Epsilon honor societies.

His articles have appeared from time to time in nationally known periodicals such as the <u>Balance Sheet</u>, <u>Business Education World</u>, <u>American Business Education</u>, <u>Business Education Forum</u>, <u>Bulletin of the National Association of Secondary School Principals</u> and others.

Gentlemen:

This will register my support of the efforts by a group of students on our campus at Eastern Illinois University to petition for affiliation with Delta Sigma Pi. This group became organized in the fall of 1963 primarily because no honor or professional society served the interests or needs of business administration students. An honor society, Pi Omega Pi, has served the interests of business education students on our campus since 1939, but no avenue of professional direction or fellowship has served the needs of business administration students. Thus I support their petition fully.

Since the degree in business administration was first afforded at this University in 1954, a determined effort has been made to provide a kind of education that would assure preparation for living, for citizenship, as well as professional preparation for personally satisfying and socially useful careers of service in phases of business:

Throughout the development of our curriculum and the eventual formation of our School of Business in 1963, every feasible effort has been made to develop a strong undergraduate program based on strong scholarship, strong curriculum and strong faculty. Degree programs have been strengthened by the incorporation of requirements in humanities, social studies, and the basic sciences. Lecture series have been instituted to bring to our campus statesmen of business and industry in order that students may meet them, hear them and discuss affairs with them.

Our university now enrolls about 3,850 students, of whom somewhat more than 700 are working toward degrees in business administration and business education. Growing at a controlled rate of about 10 per cent each year, it is anticipated that the University, by 1973 or 1974 will ultimately achieve an enrollment of about 10,000 students, roughly 2,000 of whom will be majors in business administration and business education.

An active chapter of Delta Sigma Pi can make a very real contribution toward constant, constructive improvement in our program of education for business. Thus our faculty and I support the petition of this group of students to the fullest.

HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

A "Commerce Department" was organized at Eastern Illinois University in 1937. Since Eastern Illinois University had come into being, originally, to prepare people for teaching careers, the newly created department had for its purpose the preparation of teachers of business subjects for the secondary schools. For a number of years this was the sole purpose of the Department, and graduates of the Department were awarded the professional baccalaureate degree Bachelor of Science in Education. To define more clearly the nature and spirit of its operation, the name of the Department was changed to "Business Education Department" in 1946.

In 1954, Eastern Illinois University was authorized to grant the general degrees, bachelor of science and bachelor of arts. From that date on students in general, and business students in particular, who wanted college preparation for careers of their own choosing were able to elect the degree Bachelor of Science, with a few choosing to work toward the degree Bachelor of Arts. To signify that its activities and its purpose no longer were restricted solely to the field of teacher preparation, the name of the Department was changed again, in 1960, to "Department of Business".

To provide more effectively for greater numbers of students occaisioned by the considerable growth in enrollment during the years previous to 1961, the University began a series of administrative reorganizations from which the Department of Business emerged, in October, 1962, as the School of Business with departments of Accounting, Business Education and Secretarial Studies, Management, and Marketing.

Early in 1963 the School of Business was authorized to offer work toward a second professional degree (the first being the Bachelor of Science in Education). The new degree is the Bachelor of Science in Business. The purpose of the Bachelor of Science in Business degree is to enable students to achieve, at Eastern Illinois University, a professional preparation for socially useful and personally satisfying careers of service in phases of business activity, such as accounting, sales, management and secretarial.

History of Phi Beta Mu

HISTORY OF PHI BETA MU

The formation of Phi Beta Mu began on October 10, 1963, when a group of interested business students decided to form a professional business fraternity. At this time, these students discussed this matter with Mr. Fred R. Endsley, Assistant Professor in the School of Business, member and former advisor to other chapters of Delta Sigma Pi. He enthusiastically agreed to become an advisor to the group. Another member of the faculty, Mr. Timothy D. Gover, Assistant Professor of Business and a Life Member of Delta Sigma Pi, agreed to serve as co-advisor. The object was to become a local chapter of a national professional business fraternity.

On January 14, 1964, after receiving the necessary information for the forming of the chapter, permanent fraternity officers were elected and the name, Phi Beta Mu, signifying Professional Business Men, was officially selected. After this meeting a letter, petition, and a copy of the approved constitution and by-laws was submitted to the Dean of Student Personnel Services to gain recognition as an official campus organization.

These activities culminated on February 6, 1964, when our petition to Delta Sigma Pi for a chapter charter was officially submitted.
