SAINT PETER'S COLLEGE

HESTORICAL STATEMENT

On April 3, 1872, the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey incorporated Saint Peter's College, Jersey City, New Jersey, and conferred upon it the right "to appoint professors and provide instruction in the arts, science, law, literature, and medicine and to exercise all the powers, functions, and prerogatives of a University." The College was opened to students in the Liberal Arts on September 2, 1878.

Saint Peter's College was originally located in downtown Jersey City at the site still occupied by Saint Peter's Church and Saint Peter's Preparatory School. The classic Baccalaureate in Arts was the only undergraduate degree conferred until its forty-first commencement in 1919, when faculty and student enlistment in the Army and Navy of World War I precipitated the suspension of the College.

After a lapse of eleven years the College reopened its doors in the Fall of 1930 in the Chamber of Commerce Building, not far from its former site. The revived Saint Peter's retained its distinctive character as a Jesuit College of Liberal Arts, but adapted its curricular offerings to include courses leading to the Baccalaureate in the Natural and Social Sciences. Official accreditation by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, as well as certification by the

purpose of shis education is to provide for the

New Jersey State Board of Public Instruction for Teacher-Training courses in Secondary Education, were promptly accorded. In the Fall of 1936 the College moved to its present site on Kennedy Boulevard. The enrollment at that time was four hundred students. In October 1932, the present School of Business Administration of Saint Peter's College was founded. It was an evening College only, and was acclaimed by educators and the press as "the only institution of its kind in Hudson County and the only Catholic Business College in the State." Because of the county in which in was located, it was named Hudson College. With the outbreak of World War II students were called to the services in such great numbers that Hudson College was forced to suspend operations in September 1942. In September 1945, evening classes were again resumed, and in September 1946, a day session was inaugurated offering a four year program towards a Bachelor of Science degree.

In order to dispel the confusion caused by the twofold names of both Saint Peter's College and Hudson College, the Board of Trustees decided in 1948 to discontinue the use of the latter name, Hudson College, and to bestow upon it the official name of The School of Business Administration of Saint Peter's College.

Educational Purpose

The educational structure of Saint Peter's College is built upon the traditional Jesuit base of a liberal education. The

purpose of this education is to provide for the student an intellectual, religious, social, and personal climate which will, through the combined efforts of student and faculty, promote his growth toward a more mature, cultured and competent individual, who is conscious of his rights as a person and of his obligations as a creature of God, a member of the human race, and a citizen of the United States.

The curricula have been formulated and are continuously reviewed in the light of this purpose, Each of the educational programs finds its integrating force in the courses in theology, which present anadvanced and systematic study of divine revelation of both in its dogmatic and moral aspects; each distinctively emphasizes the study of scholastic philosophy, the systematic, logical analysis of the principal problems in metaphysics, ethics, and psychology, and the study of the major solutions proposed by prominent ancient and modern philosophers; each acquaints the students with science, history, literature, and expression.

Each program of study is designed to give the student ample opportunity for concentrated study in some area of specialized interest in the arts, sciences, or business.

Academic Structure, Curricula and Degrees

Saint Peter's College comprises the following schools and divisions:

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES. Candidates may enroll for the Bachelor of Arts degree in cursu classico in the following

areas of concentration: Biology, Latin, Greek, English, Mathematics, Modern Languages, Economics, Sociology and History. (Two years of College Latin and one year of a Modern Language are required.)

Candidates may enroll for the Bachelor of Arts degree in the following areas of concentration: English, Modern Languages, Economics, Sociology and History.

Candidates may enroll for the Bachelor of Science degree in the following areas of concentration: Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Mathematics, Economics, Sociology and History.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION. Candidates may enroll for the Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration in the following areas of concentration: Accounting, Economics, Management, and Marketing. (A modern language course is an elective in Freshman year.)

<u>Collins Chemical Society</u>

The core membership of this society forms a Student Affiliate Chapter of the American Chemical Society. The activities of the society are designed to foster friendship among future professional associates, provide a forum for lectures by distinguished members of the chemical and allied professions and to prepare the members for active participation in professional societies. Students are encouraged to gain experience by preparing and presenting technical papers. The best of these are presented at joint meetings with the Student Affiliates from other colleges in the area.

Conservative Club

This organization aims to promote conservative student thought and to foster a true conservative spirit on campus through a program of discussion, panels and lectures.

Eta Sigma Phi

Eta Sigma Phi is a national honorary classical fraternity which includes fifty-nine colleges. The Gamma Pi Chapter at Saint Peter's is primarily a reading discussion group which is composed of two sections: The Philologists, who are experts in Greek or Latin language and who read the works of some classical author in the original in preparation for a Public Defense; and The Humanists, who study some aspect of classical literature, history, or philosophy in translation from the original language. The Humanists welcome all students. Both groups sponsor films,

Fine Arts Club

The Fine Arts Club promotes among the students an appreciation of the fine arts. It consists of two sections, one developing the knowledge of the members in the visual arts and the other in audio arts. Both sections meet weekly to study and discuss painting, architecture and sculpture in one group, and chamber music, symphony and opera in the other.

Gaelic Society

This group promotes an appreciation of Irish literature and culture through a program of readings, discussion and lectures.

Gannon Debating Society

This society pursues an extensive program of intercollegiate debate and public speaking competitions. It engages in forum discussions before community groups and sponsors annually a debating competition for high school students in the greater metropolitan area.

Glee Club

The Glee Club aims to cultivate a taste and appreciation for good music both in its members and in its audiences, and to stimulate good fellowship. The club always has a busy season. Besides the ten concerts that are annually scheduled at various women's colleges in the East, the club functions as the College choir in the presentation of liturgical music.

Hopkins Literary Society

The Hopkins Society is founded for the purpose of stimulating interest in both traditional and contemporary literature. Discussions and business meetings are held each week. During the year the Society sponsors three symposia in conjunction with other colleges in the area and a literary contest among the students of the college.

Forums, panel meetings and guest speakers, representing various industries, serve as mediums to enable the members to correlate the academic with actual practice and thereby meet the needs of industry.

Marketing Club

Affiliated with the American Marketing Association through the charters issued to the Day and Evening Divisions, the club concerns itself with the advancement of science in marketing. Membership is available to all students interested in marketing. Periodic meetings and discussions with guest speakers serve to develop sound thinking in marketing theory and more exact knowledge and definition of related problems.

Mendel Biology Society

The Mendel Society was organized to promote an intellectual interest in the natural science and to promote a better appreciation of the value of biological study. Membership is open to qualified students interested in biology. To stimulate the scholarly ambitions of its members, outstanding persons in the field of biology are invited to deliver special lectures. The society sponsors the Annual Mendel Lecture. Meetings are held once a month.

Peacock Company

The Peacock Company is a military organization chartered by the Association of the United States Army. Its objectives are to provide incentives for increasing military skills of its members and adding to their general military background. Membership is limited to students enrolled in the Advanced ROTC Course.

Pershing Rifles

The National Society of Pershing Rifles is a military organization designed to further and perfect military drill in colleges and universities throughout the country. The Pershing Rifles represent the college at civic parades and functions, act as honor guard for visiting dignitaries and in other capacities at various college affairs. Membership is open to all Freshmen and Sophomore ROTC cadets. Continued membership is limited to those cadets who have demonstrated military proficiency and an interest in military service and tradition.

The aim of the Forum is to familiarize its members with significant past and present developments in the field of Political Science. In addition to assigned discussion topics, panel discussions with colleges in the metropolitan area, attendance at lectures on Political Science and talks by invited speakers, there are field trips to the seats of municipal, state and national governments. Visits are also made to the various courts, municipal, state and federal, and a regular trip to the United Nations.

Pre-Engineering Club

This club aims to broaden the horizons of its members through visits to industrial centers, lectures by leaders in the engineering profession, work projects which provide a more realistic appreciation of the various fields of engineering.

The club conducts a program of field trips to penal and mental institutions in the area, to various industries and business organizations, and has frequent lectures, movies and panel discussions.

PUBLICATIONS

Pauw Wow

The student paper is written and published in its entirety by the students. It is published every two weeks and serves as a chronicle of College events, an expression of opinion and a link between the members of the College, undergraduates, alumni and faculty.

Pavan

The Pavan is the College's literary publication which appears during the Fall and Spring Terms. It is intended as a medium for the creative expression of the students and as a means of stimulating student interest in literature and the arts. Its pages are open to the writing talents of any student.

The "Pie" is the College Year Book, designed, written and published by the students. It is published about the middle of May. All students are urged to purchase a copy for each year of their college career as an attractive, permanent diary of college life and achievement at Saint Peter's.

HONOR SOCIETIES

Most Noble Order of the Peacock

The MNOP is the distinguished Honor Society of the College of Arts and Sciences. Its membership is limited to the ten top-ranking Seniors academically, and is, therefore, the reward of three year's scholastic achievement.

Order of the Cross Keys

The Order of the Cross Keys is an honor society of the College of Arts and Sciences and membership is limited to those students who combine adequate scholarship with active participation beyond the ordinary. Gold Keys are awarded on first being admitted, and Blue Keys to the members of the Order who have further distinguished themselves, but a student who meets the qualifications in a distinguished manner may be raised to the Blue Keys immediately. Election to the Order is by vote of the Blue Keys members. Each year the Keys are presented at the Cross Keys Activities Dinner to which the fathers of the members are invited.

Spur Society

The Spur Society is the honor organization of the School of Business Administration. Membership in the Society is reserved for those students and friends of the College who in some degree have rendered noteworthy service to the school, and because of their action deserve recognition beyond the ordinary. Silver Spurs are awarded on first being admitted. The Society also rewards its own members who have further distinguished themselves by conferring upon them the Order of the Golden Spur. The Spur man must have integrity, good character, ability to lead and an above-average scholastic standing. Members are tapped into the Spur Society at its annual dinner held in the Spring Semester.

HISTORY OF JERSEY CITY, NEW JERSEY

The history of Jersey City is one of more than ordinary interest, for within its borders theDutch made the first permanent settlement in New Jersey. Due to its close proximity to New York, it was the scene of many stirring events during the War of Independence. The Jersey City of today is composed of the several settlements originally scattered along the west bank of the Hudson. Its history, therefore, is the combined story of each of these communities which were finally consolidated in 1873. One in particular, the village of Bergen, was the first incorporated town and the first permanent establishment. It was this event which formed the basis of the city's Tercentenary commemoration (1660 - 1960).

A chronology of selected events abstracted from commemorative literature, follows below.

- 1660 Governor Stuyvesant granted conditional permission for settlement of Bergen.
- 1661 First court established in Bergen.
- 1664 First school was conducted in Bergen. New Netherlands surrendered to English.
- 1680 First building of Bergen Reformed Church was erected near southwest corner of Bergen Avenue and Vroom Street.
- 1708 Second school built on site of present Public School No. 11.
- 1773 New and larger building occupied by Bergen Reformed Church.
- 1776 Paulus Hook fired on British vessels in New York Harbor, but later was taken by the enemy.
- 1779 Major "Light Horse" Harry Lee captured Paulus Hook in daring enterprise within British held territory.

HISTORY OF SIGMA PI BETA

During the Spring Semester of 1963 two students of the School of Business Administration of Saint Peter's College discovered a copy of DELTASIG in the library. After careful thought and consultation with Professor William A. Huebner, they decided that the College was in need of a business fraternity.

On March 15, 1963, a letter was sent to the headquarters of Delta Sigma Pi, professional business fraternity, expressing interest in a fraternal organization on campus. Two weeks later information was received relative to rules, regulations, and organizational details of Delta Sigma Pi.

On April 15, Messrs. Robert Drew and Walter Dzitko called an informal meeting of interested students to discuss the advisability of establishing a professional fraternity in the School of Business Administration. The enthusiasm evidenced by the student body and especially those present at the meeting encouraged further investigation. Several faculty members were subsequently interviewed, and they too expressed favorable opinions about such an organization. The faculty also felt that the students in the School of Business Administration were in need of a common and unifying bond.

On April 22, a formal meeting was held with two objectives in mind, viz., the selection of a name for the campus fraternity and the election of officers. The results were the following:

On April 25, Mr. J. D. Thomson, Executive Director of Delta Sigma Pi,visited New York City to confer with representatives of the local fraternity. His visit proved to be most helpful to the fraternity. Both the President and Vice-President conferred with him regarding activities of Sigma Pi Beta and the steps required for petitioning the parent organization. The meeting proved not only to be informative but also the motivating force for the development of Sigma Pi Beta.

The committee, mindful of the advice of Mr. Thomson, began to develop a report for Administrative Officials of Saint Peter's College for their review and study. The report contained the following information: a petition signed by the student body, attitudes of the faculty, and a description of the fraternity, defining its purposes and activities.

During the Fall Semester of 1963, Sigma Pi Beta was approved by the school administration and recognized by the student council as an on-campus activity. Thus, the fraternity had acquired the recognition to perform as a club permitting it to petition Delta Sigma Pi for possible membership.

Events

On June 3, the brothers of Sigma Pi Beta held their first

social activity, a picnic at Tallman State Park, New York. The purpose of the social was to get acquainted in a circle of friendship.

The Chapter was visited on October 3 by the Regional and District Directors, Messrs. John Marko and William Myers. A formal discussion was held on the aims, purposes, and methods of organization for Delta Sigma Pi. Mr. Marko presented a history of Delta Sigma Pi while Mr. Myers answered all questions asked by the members.

The Senior Class of the School of Business Administration held a Business Luncheon Conference in the Casino-in-the-Park on October 23. Senior brothers attended and acted as hosts at each table. The principal speaker was Mr. Kingsbury Nickerson, President of the First National Bank, Jersey City, N. J. On October 31, the Constitutional Committee of Sigma Pi Beta began to formulate by-laws for the fraternity. After careful study, the completed copy was forwarded to Central Office of Delta Sigma Pi and the Eastern Regional and District Directors.

It was on December 4 that Mr. Robert Busse, Director of Advertising and Sales Development, WOR Radio and Television, addressed the members of the fraternity in the Senior Lounge of McDermott Hall. The title of his talk was "Mass Media and Communications." After the talk, a luncheon was held in the Faculty Dining Room of Dineen Hall. Attending the luncheon were Rev. Leo P. McLaughlin, S. J., Dean, Rev. Leo B. Barrows, S. J., Director of the School of Business Administration, Mr. Frank Bianco, Director of Public Relations, Professors Allen J. Goggin and William A. Huebner, both of the Department of Marketing and Management, and student officers of the fraternity.

On December 5, the fraternity was honored by the visit of the Grand President of Delta Sigma Pi, Mr. Joe Hefner, the Executive Director, Mr. J. D. Thomson, the Eastern Regional Director, Mr. John Marko, and the Eastern District Director, Mr. William Myers. At this time, Professor William A. Huebner, Fraternity Moderator, discussed the enthusiasm of the members and its progress towards the petitioning phase for eventual affiliation.

A tour was arranged for the brothers of Sigma Pi Beta to visit the Budweiser plan in Newark. It proved to be both informative and interesting. This event was held on January 10, 1964.

On February 11, 1964, the second Business Luncheon Conference was held in the Casino-in-the-Park. The guest speaker was Mr. James O. Peckham, Executive Vice-President of A. C. Nielson Company. His topic was "A Practical Approach to Today's Marketing Management Problems." Again, brothers of Sigma Pi Beta acted as student hosts and conference discussion leaders. It is anticipated that the next conference in April will be co-sponsored by the fraternity and the Senior Class of the School of Business Administration.

For the remainder of the Spring Semester, in addition to regularly called business meetings, plans call for additional social activity in March and April, an address by a faculty member to the membership, and a bi-monthly showing of business films at the conclusion of each scheduled meeting.


Mate building of the Army




