

### History of CSU East Bay



California State University, East Bay (CSUEB) was founded in 1957 as the State College for Alameda County, but for the past thirty years, it has been defined and shaped by its membership in the California State University System (CSU). In accord with the framework of the California Master Plan for Higher Education, CSUEB's primary purpose is to serve the needs of the diverse and growing population of Alameda and Contra Costa Counties for affordable, highquality baccalaureate, credential, and masters-

level degree programs.

CSUEB enrolls nearly 14,000 students (FTE: approx. 11,000). Reflecting Bay Area demographic trends of the last twenty years, the student body comprises a majority of minorities. CSUEB has always served high percentages of upper-division transfer and returning "new majority" students (part-time, older, working), including a large number of "first generation" college students.

Most of the earliest graduates of the State College of Alameda were interested in teaching careers. Consistent with the mission of the CSU, undergraduate liberal studies as preparation for teaching has remained a principal focus of academic study at CSUEB. Reflecting national, economic, and occupational trends -- perhaps even intensified by the university's proximity to Silicon Valley -- business and computer science have, since the early 80s, joined liberal studies as the most popular academic pursuits of CSUEB students.

Other important institutional background characteristics of CSUEB include its academic calendar and academic administration divisions. CSUEB is one of a handful of CSU campuses choosing to remain on the quarter system. With few exceptions, the academic programs of the university are administered by Deans and Department Chairs of four Colleges: Arts, Letters, and Social Sciences; Business and Economics; Education and Allied Studies; and Science. Decentralized administration, typical of university-level education nationally, is a feature of CSUEB highly valued by many of its most senior and influential citizens.

Student services at CSUEB receive generally high marks on student satisfaction surveys. Even so, beginning in 2001, the university redoubled its commitment to excellence in student services with a 9-point "Students First!" campaign. Its goal was to further minimize bureaucratic obstacles students might encounter in pursuit of learning and to improve services in ways that enrich students' experience and contribute to recruitment and retention efforts.

In 2002, the university opened the CSUEB Oakland Professional Development and Conference Center in downtown Oakland. The university is also raising funds for a new Business and Technology Building, which will be the first new classroom building on the Hayward campus in over 30 years.

#### Strengths

CSUEB has attractive physical campuses in Hayward and Concord, but its main strength is its people. Students, staff, and faculty feel great pride in the university. Students are deservedly proud of their academic achievements in the face of work, family, and personal responsibilities that compete with school for time, energy, and financial resources. Staff are extremely proud of their roles in managing the business of the university, in helping students and faculty with the many tasks that necessarily accompany teaching and learning, and in creating and maintaining a supportive physical and social environment for learning. Faculty are very committed to teaching, research, and connecting with students, and proud of their role in helping students succeed.

The university has demonstrated an ability to innovate in response to student needs and market opportunities, and to create productive partnerships with external communities. CSUEB is truly a year-round campus and does a better job than any other CSU campus in attracting students to attend in summer. The campus has invested in information technology to support instruction. CSUEB is one of only a few universities to make all of its courses available on a Web-based course management system (Blackboard). This one decision alone has done more than anything else to facilitate innovation in assessment practices. It has also set the stage for new initiatives in community-building and for a broader engagement of the university community in university-wide information-gathering processes concerning academic standards, ADA awareness and compliance, and health services delivery.

#### Challenges

Like all other public universities in California, CSUEB is bracing for a period of budget cuts related to the economy, while the state is experiencing increasing demands for higher education. Due to such factors as its age and administrative history, as well as previous cycles of economic and demographic boom and bust, the university is entering a period of major transitions. Many senior faculty, administrators, and staff are at or near retirement age. Although demand for higher education is increasing in absolute numbers, competition for all types of students, and especially better-prepared and self-motivated students, is increasing. The number of the tenure track faculty has shrunk, which means more part-time faculty are teaching more course sections. Most faculty see the reduction in tenure track faculty as hurting student advising, participation in university governance, and departmental business--including assessment of student learning outcomes. These conditions have engendered faculty attitudes that range from anger through frustration to despair.

The branch campus in Concord is viewed as a key resource to reach students in our extensive two-county service area. However, most feel that the university has not yet effectively incorporated the Concord campus into its operations and academic planning. Taking full advantage of the Concord campus and building its unique community is an emerging effort.

#### **Degree Programs**

Cal State Hayward offers the following degree programs at sites from 25 to over 10,000 miles from campus: MBA in Moscow, MBA in Hong Kong, MBA in Singapore, MBA in Beijing, MBA in Vienna (ended in 2002). CSUEB also offers the following degree totally online: MS in Education, Option in Online Teaching and Learning.

#### **Fields of Study**

With more than 100 majors, minors, and program options, Cal State East Bay offers you a wide choice of fields of study -- plus unlimited career possibilities. In all, you can choose from 42 baccalaureate degrees with 66 minors, 30 master's degrees, and a new joint doctoral program with UC Berkeley. Our most popular majors are Business Administration, Liberal Studies, Computer Science, Communication, Art, Psychology, and Biology. Our newest undergraduate major is Industrial Engineering, and our newest graduate major is Social Work. And, at Cal

# History of the Nu Zeta Tau Chapter

In the very beginning, Edna Lee, an initiate of the Theta Chi chapter came to California State University, East Bay and suggested that we start a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi. Approval was received from the new Dean of the business school to bring Delta Sigma Pi back to the CSU East Bay campus.

On February 16, 2004, the Nu Zeta Tau Colony of Delta Sigma Pi was officially established. In the beginning, we started with only a few members. The first District Director appointed by then Western Regional VP Amanda Smith was Mark Panelo.

The group had elections and began conducting events but development of the colony was slow initially. Activities began to accelerate in the Spring of 2005. Two representatives, including President Rohini Duvvuri, attended Grand Chapter Congress in Orlando and returned energized and enthused. After GCC, two new District Directors, Sanjay Trivedi and Claire Roberts, were appointed by newly elected Bay Area RVP Lisa Brown. In the Fall 2005, we had Rohini Duvvuri and Jimmy Yip as our President and Senior Vice President.

A strong recruiting effort in the Fall 2005 helped the colony grow from 3-5 active members to more than 15 active members. Activities included a winery tour, a Mock Interview seminar, a stress management workshop, and regular business meetings.

In November 2005, the colony created the inaugural executive committee. The executive committee became the following: Jimmy Yip, President; Manna Obad, Senior Vice President; Rohini Duvvuri, Vice President for Professional Activities; Angella Le, Vice President for Colony Operations; Sally Chen, Vice President of Finance; Sonny La, Vice President of Community Service; Ricky Wu, Chancellor; Ignacio Leon, Events Coordinator and Garrett Lew, Historian.


As the winter quarter began in January 2006, the colony again did fundraising at the local bookstore, Books on the Run. We were able to raise enough for the charter fee. The colony conducted a very effective recruiting period which included two Meet the Colony events, a pizza night, a game night, a professional tour to the Jelly Belly factory, a community service event and an informal get-acquainted event to watch the Rose Bowl. We co-hosted two career-building professional events in conjunction with the Career Development Center during the winter quarter entitled Ethics and Perfect Schmoozing.

To learn more about Delta Sigma Pi and to get acquainted with other chapters and to make themselves known, colony members attended the Area Conference at UC Berkeley to meet more fraternity brothers in the San Francisco Bay Area Region. In addition, 12 members traveled down to the recent Western Provincial Conference in Anaheim to further network with members of the Western Province.



#### **Colony Members by Class Standing**




#### **Colony Members by Option**

#### Name: Day in the Sky/Challenge Air

Type: Community Service Date: 04/23/2005 Location: Watsonville, CA

Description: Shared Adventures and Challenge Air took 137 disabled and challenged kids (plus their guests) flying in Watsonville. Volunteer pilots took 548 total passengers up; over 800 people attended the accessible-activities and assistive-technologies festival. Delta Sigma Pi volunteers helped with interpreter services, Registration desk, food services, printing certificates for children who flew, loading passengers onto planes, and reporting take-off and landing times for pilots. In spite of a little rain and some gray skies, the day went better than we could have possibly hoped for!

#### Name: Senior Center Quarterly Dinner

Location: Hayward Area Senior Center

Description: We helped coordinate a dinner and dance for seniors. We started setting up for the event at 4:00pm. We assisted by organizing and setting up the dinner tables with their appropriate table settings. At about 5:30pm we helped serve dinner and coffee/tea. We cleared up all tables and transported all dinnerware to the kitten. Once all dinnerware was washed and dried, we helped with the storage of these items. We also participated in the coordination of a few raffles that took place that evening. The individuals at the event were quite pleased with the help we provided.

Description: Members of the colony raised up to 350 dollars to support Aids research. We signed in for the walk early in the morning, listened to the San Francisco Mayor's speech, and began our walk around 10 o'clock. They were corporate companies such as Cisco, Wells Fargo, Bank of America, Gap and many more companies that participated in this event. At the end of the walk the foundation raised 3.6 million dollars. It was rewarding to contribute as much as we can to towards Aids research.
