



A Descriptive Analysis of the State University

### THE HISTORY OF THE FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY

Florida Atlantic University is one of the nine (9) member institutions of the State University System of the Florida Board of Regents. The institution was chartered in 1961 and admitted its first class of students in September, 1964. In December 1967, the University was elected to regular membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. At which time the Commission in Higher Education of that Association granted full accreditation to all of the University's programs. This accreditation was reaffirmed in 1973 and again in 1983 in accordance with Association regulations.

Florida Atlantic University is a multipurpose institution, with a threefold mission -- teaching, research and public service -- in the rapidly expanding urban environment of Boca Raton, Florida. The University originated in part because of a sense of obligation on the part of the citizens and the leaders of the state to provide higher education opportunities to this steadily increasing population. As a guideline for fulfilling its mission, the University has adopted the following statement of objectives.

Florida Atlantic University is committed to extending the educational experience of its constituency. It places particular emphasis on the development of knowledge and the acquisition of skills that will provide useful and informed citizens with the ability to adapt, intellectually and technologically, to a changing environment. As a public university in a democratic society, the University must provide the student with an understanding of humankind's place in the universe, a sense of history, a set of values and ethics, a commitment to law and morality, a respect for dignity, an appreciation of human creativity, and an analytical and inquiring mind.

The University is organized into nine Colleges: Art and Humanities, Business, Education, Engineering, Liberal Arts, Nursing, Science, Social Science, and Urban and Public Affairs.


In all instances, the organizational structure is designed to encourage students to cross departmental and college lines in planning programs to serve their special talents and interests.

Each College operates under University-wide policies. However, a distinctive feature of Florida Atlantic University is that within this general framework, each College is granted the widest latitude and encouraged to develop unique programs designed to best serve its students.

The Zeta Phi Colony of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi was founded in November of 1990. Most students who attended the first meeting ranged from either a little curious to obsessive with joining. Our membership encompasses all facets of the commercial world, allowing members to share knowledge and ideas. Although not everyone who attended that meeting is still with the fraternity, the best have remained to become brethren.

The Spring semester on 1991 was the first working semester for would-be pledges. We began to come together by holding elections, organizing weekly meetings, and planning future activities. Despite a reshuffling of some officer positions in the first weeks, the day-to-day operations began to smooth out. Officers began to find that being an officer is a lot of work and a lot of fun. The members came to find that they received as much back from the fraternity as they gave to it. All in all, the Colony came together as a whole.

The Senior Vice-President along with the Chairman of Finance helped to organize fundraising activities for the fraternity. Our fundraisers may not have been the best planned, the best run, or the most profitable, but they were a lot of fun for everyone who came out. The first major fundraiser was a car wash held in

Boca Raton, Florida and netted the Colony in excess of \$500.

Our Vice-President of Professional Activities has consistently arranged for the Colony to have speakers come before it. The Colony has had the privilege of hearing various experts on marketing, international business, finance, management, and accounting come before it. Dr. Newman gave an informative lecture on the complexities of international business, and how the world is changing economically.

The Summer of 1991 was a static time for the Colony as it suffered from small membership attendance. Many of those pledged in the Spring were away for the summer. Even this fact did not daunt those left behind. It helped to further motivate them, and the Colony as a whole, to succeed.

This semester, thanks to Delta Sigma Pi Alumni, the Colony has had the privilege to tour the Boca Raton Resort and Club. The Founders' Day Picnic with the South Florida Alumni Chapter was a time of festivity and memborance for pledges and brothers alike. It also gave an opportunity for little to get to know their big brothers. The Colony will be putting on a resume

The transformation from a group of slightly interested students to dedicated pledge brothers has been difficult. The Colony is closing its first year with a devotion toward reactivation. 




Colony Member: Jennifer Alvarez

I have been asked numerous times what Delta Sigma Pi means to me. To me, the fraternity means a way to get involved in school and learn skills that will hopefully help me career-wise.




### Colony Member: Mark Borden


### **Colony Member: Philippe Riad Boulos**
