HISTORY OF THE UNIVERSITY

Siena College is one of twenty-six Catholic Private Colleges and Universities in the United States conducted by the followers of Francis of Assisi. Siena was founded in 1937 when the Most Reverend Edmund Francis Gibbons, D. D., Bishop of Albany, invited the Franciscan Fathers of the Province of the Most Holy Name to extend their activities into his diocese. The forty acre Garrett Estate, situated in Loudonville, was purchased in April of that year, and its large brick mansion was renovated for temporary use as a College building. Bishop Gibbons placed the School under the patronage of St. Bernadine of Siena, the illustrious fifteenth century Franciscan scholar. St. Bernadine is a fitting patron for a college for he embodies the rich and deep educational tradition that the followers of St. Francis bring to Catholic education. stands also as a challenging example to the young, as a man who made the lessons of the classroom take on new life, and as a life-long student who carried his knowledge and wisdom into the busy marketplace and the stately halls of government. St. Bernadine serves then not only as a celebrated patron, but as a model master of the Arts and Sciences; above all, of the greatest art, which is the art of right-living, and the greatest science, which is the science of imparting to others the blessings of a truly liberal education. During that first year Siena College functioned as a unit of St. Bonaventure University.

With the approbation of the Very Reverend Jerome Dawson, O. F. M., Minister Provincial, ground was broken for Siena Hall in March 1938. The building was completed on June 20, 1938 and functioned as

Siena's main classroom building. The days previous to that, the new institution had received a provincial charter from the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York. Within four years the College received a permanent charter.

The early growth of Siena was phenomenal. This rapid growth is attributed partly to Siena's accessibility. Situated in the residential community of Loudonville, it is easily accessible for students from New York State's Tri-City area of Albany, Schenectady, and Troy. By 1939 a coeducational evening College was added, and the following year the enrollment totalled seven hundred men and women. The start of the scholastic year 1940-1941 found another remarkable increase in enrollment: nine hundred eighty nine day and evening students. So remarkable was Siena's growth that in October of 1941 Gibbons Hall, the College gymnasium, was completed.

With the advent of World War II, the College's growth was curtailed. Siena, accepting its resposibility, adopted an accelerated program to help the nation meet its needs. From July 1942 to August 1944, the College trained navy personnel while civilian students continued to be admitted to full academic standing. In September 1944, Siena returned to two semesters with a six week summer session.

The cessation of hostilities in 1945 marked the beginning of a new era of growth for Siena College. The large number of exservicemen who now constituted three fourths of the Student Body, necessitated the opening of a day summer school in July of 1946. That fall, the College had to rely on prefabricated classrooms and the facilities of St. Ambrose Hall in Latham to accommodate its two thousand six hundred and two registered students. The two thousand seven hundred and twenty students who registered in 1947

and the two thousand seven hundred and fifty two who registered in 1948 forced the College to once again rely on temporary classroom buildings. During this period three quonset huts were constructed for use as a library, a chapel, and a faculty office building.

These huts were later turned over to the Field Artillery ROTC unit.

Siena's growth continued both in the academic field and in the construction of new buildings. An amendment to its charter in 1947 gave the College the power to grant the honorary degrees of Doctor of Laws, Doctor of Letters, and Doctor of Humane Letters. An additional amendment in 1950 made by the New York State Board of Regents authorized Siena to grant the degrees of Master of Arts, Master of Science, Master of Science in Education, and Master of Business Administration. The St. Bernadine of Siena Friary, erected in the precendented Georgian-Colonial style of architecture, and the St. Mary of the Angels Chapel were completed in June 1950. In addition, the Department of the Army approved the application of Siena College for a Field Artillery ROTC unit, and the necessary courses were instituted in the scholastic year 1950-1951. January 1955, the Dawson Memorial Library was opened. It contained stack rooms for over one hundred twenty-five thousand volumes, and a reading room with accomodations for over four hundred students.

To accomodate the ever increasing population of boarding students, Plassman and Ryan Residence Halls, each of which accomodates two hundred and fifty students, were constructed during the years from 1959 to 1962. The dormitories commemorate Father Thomas Plassman, who was instrumental in the founding of Siena College, and Father Beneventus Ryan, a beloved professor and former provincial of the Holy Name Province. In addition, in the same years, a dining hall named after Father Junipere Serra, founder of the


California missions, was added to provide for five hundred boarding students. Mc Guire Hall, a mansion on Spring Street which boarded twenty seniors, was purchased in 1965. It presently houses as the Admissions Department of Siena College. Roger Bacon Science Center, named for the celebrated thirteenth century English Franciscan who considered science complementary to, not opposed to his faith, was opened in January 1967, and ground was broken the following March for another dormitory to accomodate three hundred students. Hennipen Hall was opened to boarding students in the fall of 1968. With most all male colleges accepting full time female students, Siena joined the ranks. In 1969 Siena officially intergrated and declared itself a coeducational institution, and devoted the top floor of Hennepin Hall for female boarding students during the scholastic year 1970-1971. In January 1970, Siena abolished its Graduate School which was instituted in May 1950. Additional purchases of land have increased the size of the Siena Campus to its present one hundred and twenty acres, and plans for further physical development, including a Student Center and an Administration Building, are already formulated. As the undergraduate enrollment approaches the two thousand mark, Siena aims to meet the educational challenge of our times.

As Siena enters its thirty-third year, the College community can be proud of the progress it has made. Its academic achievement is recognized and respected; its physical facilities have grown from one reconverted home to a campus of eight major structures, and Siena is still growing. The College has entered a new era of high quality on- campus and intense interest and influence off- campus, attempting to improve the quality of both. Although these efforts have met opposition on many fronts, students, administration, and

faculty have each year rededicated the community to constructive, Christian involvement in every area possible.

College Accredidation:

Siena College is registered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York, and accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools (January 30, 1943). The College is also a member of the following organizations: American Council on Education, Association of American Colleges, Association of Colleges and Universities of the State of New York, College Entrance Examination Board, College and University Personnel Association, College Scholarship Service, Conference of Catholic Colleges and Universities of the State of New York, Eastern College Athletic Association, Eastern College Placement Offices, Franciscan Educational Conference, Middle Atlantic Association of Colleges of Business Adminstration, Middle Eastern College Athletic Association, Mohawk - Hudson Council on Educational Television, National Association for Business Teacher Education, National Association of College and University Summer Sessions, National Catholic Educational Association, National Commission on Accrediting, New York State Welfare Conference.








A VIEM OF SIENA'S ATHLETIC FIELDS




AN EYE'S JOURNEY ACROSS THE CAMPUS

The Business Department has played a key role in the development of Siena College. In 1938 the college opened, and it was empowered to grant the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Business Administration. As enrollment expanded, students already enrolled, and applicants for the Business Division decided to grant two degrees, the Bachelor of Business Administration, for students majoring in Accounting, and a Bachelor of Science for those concentrating in the second Business major, Economics. Enrollment in the Business Division immediatly exceeded that of the Arts and Science Divisions. Classes in the Division were offered for full-time day students, and part time evening students. As the Business Department continued to show its importance to the Siena Community, application was made for a CPA registration of the Accounting Major with the State Department of Education and this Application was granted.

Because of World War II enrollment delined drastically, as was the case at other Colleges and Universities. During World War II courses continued to be offered both day and evening. After the war the Business Division increased its enrollment to an all time high of 1,499 students, along with this came increased facilities and faculty.

Largely in response to the demand from the large commercial banks of the area, togeather with insurance companies and other business organizations, it was deemed desirable to offer an expanded program and offer a concentration in the field of Finance in 1950. During the 1950's a number of curriculum changes were made in response to the students and the business world. Then in 1963 the Business Division decided to add a fourth major, that of Marketing, partially because this area is such an important distribution center.

At present, under the direction of DR. Buff, the Business Division offers majors in Accounting, Economics, Finance, and Marketing. There are also two service departments of Business Law and Mathematics for Business and Statistics. In the current semester the distribution of seniors is as follows according to major:

Accounting 78
Economics 35
Finance 32
Marketing 70

HISTORY OF SIGMA BETA SIGMA

Sigma Beta Sigma Siena College Business Society was first formed on an organized basis in Febuary, 1948. At their first meeting Francis W. Fitzgerald was named President. Also at this meeting John O. Burns was named the societies secretary. Here he set down the purpose of the society in a statement that, " Sigma Beta Sigma was formed to hear speakers tell of the trends in business and the possibilities in the accounting and economic fields. It was tosupplement the business education of it's members and to help him obtain a practical knowledge of elementary business applications while still in attendance at Siena." Sigma Beta Sigma employed several money making ventures in it's early years, the most popular being the holding of banquets. One such guest speaker included the Supreme Court Justice, William H. Murray of Troy, New York. These events were opened to all interested people.

Late in 1948 the Business Society announced plans fort the publication of their own newspaper which would print all matters of interest to business students.


Sigma Beta Sigma, however, did not only direct itself towards business flunctions but also took strong interest in other activities; such I.M. Basketball, which marked many fine school teams, each having been fielded by Sigma Beta Sigma support.

A calendar of fraternity events for Sigma Beta Sigma

throughout the 1950's and continuing into the 60's has included many commercial tours, opened to all interested. Such adventures have included trips to, The International Paper Co., Beechnut Life Saver Corp., in Canojohaire, N.Y., tradition has also called for a yearly pilgrimage to Wall Street, still sponsored today. This organization has also played a civic role. It has sponsored many father, son gatherings, orphanage pleas. The society also sponsors a number of awards to graduating seniors.

The strength of this organization has indeed come out of the past. With such a structure as Sigma Beta Sigma it has added flexability for todays officers. Expansion is still demanded, National charter holds for ūs this key, we than participate at level of efficiency.


