A HISTORY OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO

The University of Northern Colorado is a multipurpose institution offering a wide range of graduate and undergraduate degree programs in five colleges. These are: the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Business Administration, the College of Education, the College of Health and Human Sciences, and the College of Performing and Visual Arts.

The teaching and administrative personnel of UNC have created a highly prized balance between the personal contact found typically in a small institution and the broad range of cultural, social, and intellectual opportunities found in a large university.

The University offers approximately 2,700 academic courses annually and enrolls approximately 10,500 students. The student enrollment consists of 40% men and 60% women from 49 states and 48 foreign countries; 84% undergraduates, 15% graduate students; 88% residents, 12% non-residents and 12% minorities.

UNC is located in the city of Greeley, Colorado, approximately one hour north of the city of Denver and approximately one hour east of Rocky Mountain National Park. Greeley is a mid-sized city of 65,000 people (counting UNC students). Greeley has a symphony, jazz and rock concerts, community and collegiate theatre, as well as America's largest 4th of July rodeo. It has a dry, high desert climate with sunny days and cool nights. There is some snow and very little rain.

The 236-acre campus has two very distinct, adjacent parts. Both have residence halls and classroom buildings. The central campus features a tree-lined

green and older, ivy covered buildings while the west campus is distinguished by modern high-rise buildings.

The University of Northern Colorado celebrated its one-hundredth birthday during 1989 and 1990. The University was founded in 1889 when a bill was drafted in the Colorado legislature providing for a State Normal School. The law creating the school was signed on April 1, 1889. The citizens of Greeley raised the necessary money for the first building and the cornerstone was laid on June 13, 1890.

Designed to train qualified teachers for the state's public schools, the Sate Normal School began on October 6, 1890, with a staff of four instructors and 96 students. Certificates were granted upon the completion of a two-year course.

In 1911 the school's name was changed to Colorado State Teacher's College by the state legislature. The college was then offering four years of undergraduate work and granting the bachelor of arts degree.

In 1935 the name of Colorado State College of Education was adopted to recognize the fully developed graduate program, which was started in 1913. Early in 1957 the state approved shortening the name to Colorado State College. Again, to recognize the further growth and offerings, in 1970 the name was change once more, this time to the University of Northern Colorado.


Since 1916, the University had been fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

American Dietetic Association; The National League of Nursing; National Recreation and Park Association/American Association for Leisure and Recreation; and the Society for Public Health Education



HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The University of Northern Colorado's College of Business Administration (COBA) offers a Bachelors of Science Degree in Business Administration with opportunities for students to pursue specialized study in the emphasis areas of Accounting, Computer Information Systems, Finance, Management, Marketing, and Foreign Trade and Commerce as well as in General Business Administration. The College offers a minor in Business Administration and a minor in Computer Information Systems.

The College of Business
Administration was established in the summer of 1968 as an autonomous degree-recommending unit with a primary mission of providing education for business administration. Since that time, the business school has received a \$4.8 million renovation in 1986, resulting in a total-make-over. The addition of over \$2 million in computing and technology upgrades has led the business school's current reputation throughout Colorado.

COBA's primary goal is to provide highly quality undergraduate instruction for the benefit of its students. Grounded in the liberal arts, business classes apply theory to practical business problems. The curriculum incorporates computer technology and weighs the opportunities and challenges of competing in a global marketplace. Students interact with distinguished business leaders who give lectures and hold visiting professorships.

Professional accreditation is a recognition of outstanding quality in an academic program as measured through an evaluation of its faculty, curriculum, students, and the overall academic environment. Since 1992, UNC's business programs have been accredited by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). UNC is currently one of only six undergraduate-only business programs in the U.S. to receive separate AACSB accreditation for both its business administration and accounting programs.

Alpha Psi Theta had many social activities during the Fall semester. We started with a night of bowling followed by pumpkin carving for Halloween. Next was ice skating in Fort Collins.

Several members attended the Mu Rho chapter's annual winter formal.

The formal, "An Evening Under the Mistletoe," was held at the Executive Towers in downtown Denver. Everyone had a great time.

During the Spring semester we had a movie night and our first annual spring retreat. This event took place at the Christie Lodge in Vail. The weekend consisted of shopping, skits, games, and skiing. It proved to be a fun way for everyone to get to know each other better. The semester came to a close with our final event, an end of the year barbecue.










Membership According to Class Standing




