Provincial Goals

1) Cultivate Leadership at collegiate and alumni levels

We continue to use our time to find volunteer leaders at a variety of levels. We've utilized collegiate members to present at regional conferences, brothers who ran for elected positions that weren't elected in a variety of roles, and continue to identify and converse with future leaders. We also hosted a COY webinar that was put on by our national chair and most recent Provincial COY, Brikken Jensen, that was highly attended and engaged brothers from across the country.

2) Identify expansion opportunities in the Province

The colony at Cleary University plans to petition in the spring with a hopeful installation in the fall. Other efforts being made by RVPs with ongoing conversations at a few campuses.

3) Improve event impact by carefully examining areas for improvement or advancement

Through the leadership of our Provincial Professional Development Chair, Jillian Gartner, and staff we have put on one successful LEAD School with more updates coming through the ideas shared by all of those in the province. We will continue to look for ways to build on our foundation of programming while adapting to the needs of the province.

4) CMP Achievements – 80% accredited; 40% recognition; 20% excellence.

RVPs continue to work with chapters on their CMP platforms, especially with the new requirements of some ritual items. As of early January, chapters have a 48% approval rate for Accredited, a 57% approval rate for Recognition, and a 37% approval rate for Excellence.

5) Have all DDs Certified Deltasig Leaders

Nearly half of the DDs (all 41 chapters have a DD!) are at least Tier 1 CDL.

LEAD Schools/LEAD Provincial

We had low attendance at the LEAD School in Omaha. Some of these low numbers came from multiple regions going to the Northeastern LEAD and two of the regions hosting a regional conference. More regional conferences are being planned for spring and fall terms to complement the LEAD programming. The attendance at the LEAD Provincial in Milwaukee has seen good early registration numbers.

Discipline and Chapter Assistance

During the first term of the biennium we were met with some challenges regarding risk management. One of those has caused a chapter to be placed on probation by their University and, subsequently, the Board of Directors. That chapter is performing well and working towards a restored relationship with the university.

We have also had issues regarding risk management relating to the pledge education program and alcohol. Those incidents continue to be monitored and may result in further actions with those chapters.

I'm pleased with the immediate and internal actions taken by the chapters that have had an incident regarding risk management violations. Please continue to operate with a high level of integrity and character personally and fraternally.

Summary

This first few months of the biennium has been a bit of a whirlwind. We had tremendous turnover in our province. We have three new RVPs, a complete turnover with our provincial chairs, a new PVP, and a RVP race at GCC that ended in a tie which was later decided through our proper course of fraternal action by the region. I believe we have some work to do as we continue to bond as a provincial team which will be assisted by a future leadership retreat. We have a team that is dedicated to serving those in this province. We have a strong group of future leaders that will continue to hold our current leaders to a high standard. Thanks to all of those brothers serving in whatever way you are at this point, title or not. You are an important and integral part of the success of this province and provide a positive impact on the brothers of this province.

Strengths:

- CMP Achievements:
 - 4 very strong chapters that consistently receive Chapter of Recognition and/or Chapter of Excellence
 - All chapters are on pace to achieve at least Accredited chapter status for 2017-18
- Chapters continue to have a strong sense of brotherhood
- High quality community service and professional events
- Strong initiation numbers: 145 new brothers, up 4 from previous year

Weaknesses:

- CMP items still seem to be submitted at the last minute, with a few chapters still submitting things late or not at all
- Chapters don't always seem to plan events in advance, especially bigger events like initiations and LEADs
- DDs are not utilized as much as they could be
- There seems to be a general complacency with the status quo

Regional Goals

- 1) CMP Performance: 100% Accredited, 40% recognition, 20% excellence
 - a. Unfortunately, only 4 chapters reached accredited status in the 2016-2017 CMP year. Officer reports, risk management events, Bylaws/P&P, and Pledging Ceremonies seem to be the most missed/late events as a region. I hope to improve upon this by having 100% of chapters accredited by the end of the biennium. On the bright side, the chapters that reached accredited status also reach chapter of recognition with 3 out of the for reaching chapter of excellence as well. I hope to work with these strong chapters to come up with a CMP Best Practices guide to assist the chapters that are struggling.
- 2) Every District Director to become a Certified Deltasig Leader
 - a. As of January 2018, only myself and one other District Director is a CDL. There is one alumnus in the area with her CDL that I hope to transition into a District Director position soon. I plan to have all District Directors get their CDL by the end of the 2017-2018 academic year.
- 3) 100% Ritual memorization as part of new CMP requirements
 - a. To my knowledge all but one chapter successfully memorized ritual for the Fall 2017. Semester. I plan to reach out to the chapter that did not memorize in order to ensure 100% memorization for Spring 2018.
- 4) National Event Attendance
 - a. Eight out of the nine chapters attended the Cincinnati LEAD School in the Fall. The ninth chapter was unable to attend but did attend a regional conference put on by the Great Lakes RVP. Eight out of nine chapters are also registered for Spring Provincial as of 1.9.18

Discipline and Chapter Assistance

Over the past year the region has done fairly in term of risk management issues. There was one chapter with an issue, but it was handled very professionally, and I am proud of the way the chapter (and especially chapter president) handled the issue. Upsilon has improved exponentially after their suspension in Fall of 2015 and I am very excited about their future. There are two chapters experiencing low membership; however, these chapter have very strong leadership that I'm sure will be able to guide them through this challenging time.

Summary and Conclusion

I am extremely honored to be able to continue to serve as Central RVP and I'm very proud of the improvements the region has made over the past 2/3 years. Three chapters received visits from Central office staff this fall semester and I look forward to working with those chapters using the feedback from the visits. I also hope to attend more chapter events/meetings than just the typical pledging ceremony/initiation. I have two events tentatively scheduled, and I look forward to scheduling more as the semester progresses. The Central Region made great progress this year, and I look forward to even more progress in 2018!

- Timely and accurate Chapter Management Program (CMP) submissions.
- Compliance with the risk management, insurance, and conduct policy.
- Compliance with the standard pledge education program.

Great Lakes Regional Goals:

1. District Director Communication: Administer monthly calls with the Region's District Directors (DD) to provide guidance, discuss chapter issues and answer questions.

Status: I have held conference calls with the Great Lakes Leadership Team in September, November, and December that have addressed near-term CMP deadlines, pledge education program, initiation guidelines, role and election of chapter advisor, potential chapter expansion, and upcoming regional, provincial, and national events. In addition, I have scheduled several one-on-one calls with DDs to discuss chapter issues or concerns in detail.

2. Risk Management: Ensure that each chapter in the Region is working to comply with the risk management, insurance, and conduct policy of Delta Sigma Pi.

Status: I planned a Regional Conference that took place on September 23, 2018 in Chicago, IL. While the event did not have a specific session on risk management, we did address this topic during the pledge education program and mock initiation. In addition, I discuss risk management on the monthly DD conference calls and encourage collegiate members to attend the risk management sessions at North Central LEAD events.

3. Relationship with Chapter Advisor: Identify and implement methods for enhancing the chapter's relationship with the chapter advisor and school.

Status: I have asked each chapter to take additional steps to plan events for the business/economics faculty and faculty Deltasigs as well as incorporate these details within the chapter's strategic plan submissions for Fall 2017 and Spring 2018. In addition, on the November DD conference call, I discussed the role and election of a chapter advisor as well as ways to encourage a chapter advisor to become more involved through participation in chapter events, attendance at regional, provincial, or national events periodically, and review of CMP progress with the VPCO monthly.

4. Training: Identify training needs for collegiate chapters in the Region.

Status: The Great Lakes Regional Conference included sessions on scholarships and awards, officer transitions, the pledge education program, and teambuilding. We also conducted a mock initiation and involved both collegiate and alumni members. We chose session topics based on feedback we received from each of the 10 collegiate chapters in the Great Lakes Region. We also decided to administer a mock initiation to reinforce the correct way to conduct part 1 of the ceremony. In addition, I've decided to attend one pledge meeting per chapter during the 2017-2018 fiscal year to reinforce program guidelines presented during the pledge education program session at the Regional Conference. During the Fall 2017, I attended pledge meetings at Alpha Omega (DePaul University), Delta (Marquette University), Kappa Phi (Valparaiso University), and Xi Chi (UW-Milwaukee). I presented an overview of the pledge program and discussed common issues that the Great Lakes Leadership Team has observed in the Region. Lastly, the Great Lakes Leadership Team continues to encourage collegiate members to attend provincial events and we are planning to recognize chapters for participation and travel to the 2018 North Central LEAD Provincial Conference in Milwaukee, WI. The award recipients will receive special recognition during the event and one paid registration for the chapter's delegate at the 2019 North Central LEAD Provincial Conference in Chicago, IL.

Regional Summary:

The Great Lakes Region is performing in a satisfactory manner, and has improved. The Region continues to focus on timely and accurate submission of CMP items to achieve Accredited Chapter status. Although some chapters have completed all CMP items within the required deadline during the fiscal year, several other chapters have failed to receive credit for more than one CMP item. In addition, the DDs and I continue to work with the collegiate chapters to ensure compliance with the pledge education program and to ensure the initiation ceremony is administered appropriately. I have engaged the DDs both during and outside of our monthly conference calls to discuss these areas and to provide ongoing guidance to the collegiate chapters. We plan to continue these efforts during ritual practices and the day of the initiation ceremony. Also, as mentioned above, I'm focusing on the administration of the pledge education program throughout the Region and I plan to attend one pledge meeting for each of the 10 collegiate chapters in 2017-2018. Lastly, 10 of the 11 DDs or 91 percent in the Great Lakes Region are Certified Deltasig Leaders, an increase from 8 of 12 DDs or 67 percent last year.

There were six collegiate chapters in the Region that attended the LEAD in Cincinnati, OH and two collegiate chapters that attended the LEAD in Sacramento, CA. There were nine collegiate chapters that attended the Great Lakes Regional Conference in Chicago, IL. All ten collegiate chapters attended either a Fall LEAD or the Regional Conference. I expect that the Region will be well represented at the North Central LEAD Provincial in Milwaukee, WI as members of all 10 collegiate chapters and one alumni chapter are registered to attend.
