The North Central Provincial Council Meeting of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi, Inc. was called to order according to Ritual at 1:34pm on February 25, 2017 by North Central Provincial Vice President Jodi Schoh at the Hyatt Regency in Schaumburg, IL.

At this time, Schoh relinquished the chair to Chancellor Hagerty who introduced Secretary Stier. Stier then conducted the Roll Call of Delegates and announced 50 delegates present and eligible to vote. **See Addendum A for present and absent chapters.**

Grand Rapids Alumni Chapter then moved to amend the Agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Lincoln Nebraska Alumni Chapter and approved.

Twin Cities Alumni Chapter then moved to adopt the Agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Chicago Alumni Chapter and approved.

Des Moines Iowa Alumni Chapter moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the 2016 North Central Provincial Council Meeting and to approve the minutes as previously distributed. Seconded by Alpha Omega and approved.

Zeta Chapter moved to receive the printed Official Reports as distributed to the delegates. Phi Tau Chapter seconded and the motion was adopted. **See Addendum B.**

Zeta Chapter moved to receive the financial report. The motion was seconded by Pi Tau Chapter and approved. **See Addendum C.**

OLD & NEW BUSINESS

Chancellor Hagerty then noted there was no old business and moved into new business.

Chancellor Hagerty called a point of order, assuming there are no objections the chair is going to recognize delegates from Xi Chi Chapter and Detroit – Motown Alumni Chapter who will be able to fully participate as members of the council for the remainder of the meeting. 52 delegates now present and able to vote.

Alpha Pi then moved the 2017-2018 Provincial Budget. The motion was seconded by Delta Rho.

The 2017-2018 Provincial Budget was then adopted. See Addendum D.

Chancellor then yielded the floor to Schoh. Schoh moved to allocate the 2016-2017 Provincial potential budget surplus as follows: 78% to the 2018 Lead Provincial and 25% to the North Central Provincial Scholarship Fund. Motion was seconded by Upsilon. Motion was the adopted.

Delegates voted by secret ballot the Location and Date of the 2019 Provincial Conference and Council Meeting.

The Listing of Preference for the 2019 Provincial Conference and Council Meeting was then adopted.

Chancellor Hagerty entertained a motion to suspend Roberts Rules during the executive session. Kappa Sigma moved the motion, and Gamma Pi seconded the motion.

Executive session was extended by majority vote until 3:03pm.

Chancellor Hagerty announced that straw polls (nonbinding unofficial votes) would be taken on the following proposals/recommendations:

- 1. Honorary Initiation (proposed by Ritual Review Team): A review of Part I was requested by the Board of Directors after the 2015 Grand Chapter Congress based on a request from the Grand Chapter. As a part of the review, the Ritual Review Initiative team reviewed other potential changes based on items that the prior Ritual Task Force opted not to include in prior proposals and also on input from Brothers across the country. This recommendation adds the Preamble to the Bylaws to the beginning of the Honorary Initiation ceremony no Chapters opposed
- 2. Gender Neutral Language in Ritual: (proposed by Ritual Review Team): A review of Part I was requested by the Board of Directors after the 2015 Grand Chapter Congress based on a request from the Grand Chapter. As a part of the review, the Ritual Review Initiative team reviewed other potential changes based on items that the prior Ritual Task Force opted not to include in prior proposals and also on input from Brothers across the country. This recommendation is a consolidated recommendation to make changes throughout the Ritual Book to standardize the gender neutral language 2 Chapters opposed
- Altering Part I of Initiation (Proposed by Board of Directors): The delegates of the 50th
 Grand Chapter Congress requested that the Board of Directors to conduct a review of
 Part I of The Initiation Ceremony 32 Chapters for, 16 Chapters opposed

Delta Chapter moved to reinstate Robert's Rules. Motion was seconded by Epsilon Omega.

Schoh made announcements and then Hagerty invited others to make announcements.

Provincial Goals

1) CMP Achievements – 80% accredited; 40% recognition; 20% excellence.

RVPs continue to work with the chapters on obtaining at a minimum accredited level of CMP. Last year, only 53% of the chapters achieved accredited status. We currently have four chapters on guidance for being below 85% requirement of the accredited level.

Every District Direct to become a Certified Deltasig Leader (CDL.

Currently, 37% of the District Directors are CLDs.

3) Identify expansion opportunities in the Province.

We are in the process of starting a colony at Cleary University. The colony at Bradley University has been dissolved.

LEAD/Provincial

The Fall LEAD School in Grand Rapids had lower than expected attendance by the Province. Many of the chapters attended the LEAD School in Overland Park due to proximity. Three of the regions had a regional conference, which added a benefit of more training and sharing of ideas between chapters.

Discipline and Chapter Assistance

Over the past year, the province continues to deal with some although less severe risk management violations. Two chapters received warning letters, one for alcohol and underage drinking at a LEAD event and the other one for violating the BYOB alcohol policy.

We also had one chapter accept receivership from the Board of Directors this fall due to low membership. I am happy to report the chapter increased membership and I am excited about their future.

Summary

It has been a busy fall term. We hosted two webinars presented by 2015 Collegian of the Year, Chad Robinson for all nominees on best practices on their application process. The leadership team is also working on how to better educate the chapters and volunteers leads on ritual based on observations from attending various initiations this past semester. Finally, the team is working on transitioning as the end of the biennium will be here in a few months.

- 100% attendance at National Events
 - 7/9 chapters attended the Grand Rapids LEAD with the other 2 chapters attending the Overland Park LEAD
 - o 7/9 chapters currently registered for Provincial LEAD in Schaumburg
- Each chapter Nominate/Submit a COY
 - o All 9 chapters nominated a COY
 - o 8/9 chapters completed their application
 - This was an extremely strong group of COY nominations this year, so I hope to see that trend continue

 - o 6/9 chapters accomplished this in 2016, so I would love to improve upon that number in

- Six of Seven DDs are Certified Deltasig Leaders with five of those reaching Tier 2 status
- Chapter Management Program. All 6 collegiate chapters are on pace to achieve at least Accredited, five are on pace for Recognition, and all but two chapters appear to be striving for Excellence
- Alumni Chapter is strong with a variety of impactful and entertaining events executed
- Awards have been a strength with each chapter completing at least one award application for previous year and all submitting a COY nominee for current year

Weaknesses/Opportunities for Improvement:

- Transitions among individual officers and chapters as a whole has been improving, but continues to be an area of focus
- National Event Participation 31 in LEAD 2015, 24 to LEAD 2016; 69 to Provincial 2016, 41 registered for 2017 (as of 1/16)

Regional Update:

We have made much progress while improving on the foundation of success in the region since I became RVP mid-term at the 2016 Provincial Conference.

Each chapter has a District Director that is committed to assisting the chapters in their initiatives relating to the regional goals. Although we had some expected turnover with the DDs, we have transitioned smoothly with communication being a primary focus.

There has been strong communication with the DDs to assist them in directing the chapters in relation to their chapter goals and regional goals. Through this process we have maintained regular contact varying on needs through a variety of mediums.

During the spring semester we will focus on continuing to reach out to future volunteer leaders (over 25 have been identified-contact me if you know of any or are one yourself!), begin regular DD calls in addition to one-on-ones, and continue to assist all chapters in their pursuits of excellence (CMP or otherwise).

The Twin Cities Alumni Chapter was one of only four chapters in the country to achieve the Gold level of the Alumni Recognition Program for the prior year and continues their events that benefit collegiate and alumni members alike.

Two of the chapters received consultant visits from the Central Office staff that discovered both strengths and areas of opportunity that the chapters are working on throughout the year.

We had a small regional conference in November for those that were unable to attend the LEAD which was in Grand Rapids, MI. That includes me who had some wedding obligations. Although the group was small and there were areas of improvement for future events, those in attendance gained valuable insights. Thanks to all of those that put this event together!

Although we haven't yet reached all of our goals, we are diligently pursuing and striving to achieve them. This will include pursuing expansion opportunities which will be a collaborative effort with the Central Office this semester.

Weaknesses/Opportunities for Improvement:

- Timely and accurate Chapter Management Program (CMP) submissions.
- Compliance with the risk management, insurance, and conduct policy.

Great Lakes Regional Goals:

1. District Director Communication: Administer monthly calls with the Region's District Directors (DD) to provide guidance, discuss chapter issues and answer questions.

Status: I have held conference calls in September, November, December, and January that have addressed near-term CMP deadlines, pledge education program and initiation guidelines, and upcoming regional and national events. In addition, I have scheduled several one-on-one calls with DDs to discuss chapter issues or concerns in detail.

2. Risk Management: Ensure that each chapter in the Region is working to comply with the risk management, insurance, and conduct policy of Delta Sigma Pi.

Status: I planned a Regional Conference that took place on October 23, 2016 in Madison, Wisconsin. At that meeting, Greek University CEO Mike Ayalon was our keynote speaker and he presented a 90-minute session on Hazing. In addition, I discuss risk management with DDs periodically on our monthly conference calls.

3. Relationship with Chapter Advisor: Identify and implement methods for enhancing the chapter's relationship with the chapter advisor and school.

Status: I have asked each chapter to take additional steps to plan events for the business/economics faculty and faculty Deltasigs as well as incorporate these details within the chapter's strategic plan submissions for Spring 2017.

4. Training: Identify training needs for collegiate chapters in the Region.

Status: The Great Lakes Regional Conference included sessions on recruiting, fundraising, Delta Sigma Pi trivia, networking, and staying involved in Delta Sigma Pi after graduation. We chose session topics based on feedback we received from each of the 10 collegiate chapters in the Great Lakes Region. In addition, the Great Lakes Region leadership team continues to encourage collegiate members to attend North Central LEAD events.

Regional Summary:

The Great Lakes Region is performing in a satisfactory manner. The Region continues to focus on timely and accurate submission of CMP items to achieve Accredited Chapter Status. Although some chapters have completed all CMP items within the required deadline during the fiscal year, several other chapters have failed to receive credit for more than one CMP item. In addition, the DDs and I continue to work with the collegiate chapters to ensure compliance with the pledge education program and to ensure the initiation ceremony is administered appropriately. I have engaged the DDs both during and outside of our monthly conference calls to discuss these areas and to provide ongoing guidance to the collegiate chapters. We plan to continue these efforts during ritual practices and the day of the initiation ceremony. I am planning to meet with several chapters individually during Spring 2017 to discuss pledge program or initiation concerns that the DD and/or myself observed in the Fall 2016. Lastly, eight of the

12 DDs in the Great Lakes Region are Certified Deltasig Leaders, an increase from the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

There were five of 10 collegiate chapters represented at LEAD in Grand Rapids, Michigan. I expect that the Region will be well represented at the North Central LEAD Provincial in Chicago, IL as several representatives from six of the 10 collegiate chapters are registered to attend. I plan to work with the DDs of the remaining four chapters to ensure that each chapter is represented.
