# THE INTERNATIONAL FRATERNITY OF DELTA SIGMA PI NORTHEASTERN PROVINCIAL COUNCIL MEETING

# FEBRUARY 8, 2009 CINCINNATI, OHIO

Chancellor Renee Staul (Mu Pi) called the meeting of the Northeastern Provincial Council of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi to order according to Ritual at 8:49 am on Sunday, February 8, 2009 at the Marriott Cincinnati Northwest, in Cincinnati, OH

Brother Renee Staul (Mu Pi) served as chancellor of the meeting and Brother Renee Stewart (Eta Xi) served as recording secretary.

Brother Corinne Schilberg (Mu Pi) presented the credentials report (Addendum III). Thirty seven delegates were present and voting at this meeting, out of the 56 eligible. This constituted quorum of the Northeastern Provincial Council.

- Approximately 4K still remaining
- •Recommend That the money goes back to the chapters sitting at the Buffalo 2008 Provincial Council that were fully registered, even if they were unable to vote at that time.

# **GENERAL COMMENTS**

Generally, the chapters in the province are on target for a successful year. The amount of interaction between chapters has increased, alumni are increasing their involvement, and CEI is strong compared to the other provinces.

#### PROVINCIAL GOAL SUMMARY

#### Leadership

There continues to be a struggle to find volunteer leadership in the East Central Region. This region has been underserved with respect to District Directors for some time now, and the lack of consistent national leadership is evident with some chapters. As we begin talking about plans for the next biennium, we will strategize a recruiting plan for alumni involvement with the East Central chapters.

I have seen tremendous participation by alumni and collegiate members in various activities including provincial or national committees or task forces, LEADs, regional events, and chapter events. There has been a wealth of interest in volunteering at this level throughout the province.

#### **CHAPTER OPERATIONS**

#### CEI

Overall CEI performance is strong, with the provincial average highest in the nation. Naturally, at the chapter level there are some chapters way out in front and others lagging. RVPs are working with those chapters to help maximize their efforts towards CEI goals.

#### **Finances**

Provincial debt has been kept at a minimum this year. The exception is Xi Upsilon, which has made significant efforts to reduce outstanding debt.

### Chapter Expansion

City College of New York joined the list of colonies in the province this year. Adelphi will be installed in March and Pace and Lehigh are working towards fall installations. All four colonies are in the Eastern Region, which also has eight collegiate chapters. This has been a challenge for RVP Tom Calloway, but the close proximity of most of the chapters has been beneficial.

### Alumni Chapters

I am pleased also to report a new set of officers for the DC Metro Alumni chapter, which has essentially been dormant for a period. While alumni enthusiasm is strong throughout the province, most of the alumni chapters have been struggling for consistent participation. The leadership team is working to support them in organizing chapter activities.

#### Provincial/National Events

LEAD attendance continues to be high in the province. LEAD programming is being supported in a variety of ways by the contributions of collegiate and alumni members. Regional events have seen good participation as well, including officer trainings hosted by RVPs.

As several colonies have reached new points in their path to chartering, volunteers have been accessible. To keep this atmosphere going, collegiate brothers have been stepping forward in advance of graduation.

 This represents a slight decline from last year, but still shows great promise as a region.
 Additionally, more chapters are actively pursuing and preparing for other chapter awards.

With the upcoming changes to the chapter efficiency index (CEI), this goal needs reevaluated.

#### o (Undetermined) Increase alumni involvement

Alumni relations programs and activities at a majority of the chapters have remained status quo, however there have been indications that more alumni are remaining involved and supportive of their chapter without getting involved at a national level or with an alumni chapter affiliation.

#### o (Improving) Increase chapter interaction

The year started off with a Regional Conference in September to help get chapters talking and to help kick off some chapter interaction while also helping chapters share. More chapter interaction followed.

During the last year and a half, the region has enjoyed the volunteer services of ten (10), four (4) this year alone, brothers who had never served in alumni leadership capacities.
