## REPORT OF THE WESTERN PROVINCIAL VICE PRESIDENT Chuck Brown

#### **General Comments:**

The province continues to do well. A number of regional events and initiations were held throughout the fall. In addition, the centennial was celebrated throughout the province. We also have a number of initiatives going on in the province detailed in this report.

#### Leadership Development:

With my appointment as the Northwestern RVP, the province currently has no RVP vacancies. One chapter has not been appointed a District Director; however, that should soon change.

The province continues to maintain a strong focus on leadership identification and development through the branded the campaign of "Team West." At Grand Chapter Congress, Team West ribbons were given to alumni volunteers from the province and we continue to give out Team West pins to those volunteers that attend national events.

We are currently scheduling two Team West Leadership Training sessions, one in Northern California and the other in Southern California. Dates are to be determined. We are also exploring the possibility of training in the Rocky Mountain Region.

#### Awards:

We had 35 chapters (90%) in the province nominate a chapter COY. Up from 87% the previous year and our second year in a row of obtaining an increase.

The regional selection committees mostly included non-district directors, allowing for involvement of additional brothers. The provincial awards committee and RVPs are currently promoting participation in the end of the year awards. The province will be doing a seminar on awards at the provincial conference and identification of targeted awards is on the agenda for the regional meetings. A concentrated focus on increasing alumni chapter participation is currently underway.

## LEAD School:

The province had 33 of its collegiate chapters attend the San Jose LEAD School. We also had five alumni chapters. One additional collegiate chapter attended the Houston LEAD School.

Overall, the San Jose LEAD School was a success, with approximately 250 brothers in attendance. While our keynote speaker was not very well received (but he was free), Craig Nathanson, another guest speaker, received positive remarks.

The LEAD School presenters were equipped with the province's "presenter guide" that contained helpful tips and other useful information. We also distributed a presenter survey that provided feedback on participants and materials and ask for suggestions for improvement. The Western Province's Professional Development Chair combined the results of this survey with the Zoomerang Survey to draft a comprehensive executive summary regarding the LEAD School.

The province hosted the Fourth Annual Make a Difference, Make a Drop, which raised more than \$200 for the Red Cross Southern California Fire Relief Fund.

The province continued the promotion of the centennial by holding a fraternity history roundtable and by hosting a separate dessert reception and toga dance.

- Dissemination of monthly provincial newsletter.
  - Westwords Newsletter disseminated to the chapters and DDs in the fall.
  - Increase participation in alumni chapter end of the year awards.
    - Promotion plans currently being developed.

#### Expansion:

We continue to work with the Sigma Beta lota colony at University of California, Irvine. Their goal is currently a late spring installation.

We received permission from the California State University, Monterey to start a colony and alumni are leading those efforts.

Alumni efforts are also being organized at California State University, Los Angeles and University of California, Santa Barbara. We also received student interest from University of California, Santa Cruz and University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

To further the momentum of provincial expansion, the Western Province Expansion Guide and Handbook continues to be updated on a consistent basis and consulted when exploring opportunities.

The San Francisco Alumni Chapter was also recently franchised and there are currently efforts on inCircle to organize a Northern Colorado Alumni Chapter and Portland Alumni Chapter.

#### **Discipline Issues:**

## Provincial Committee: Community Service

## Accomplishments:

A pop tab collection drive benefiting the San Diego Chapter of the Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMCH) is taking place as I write this report. The goal of the event is to collect aluminum pop tabs to help raise money for RMCH. Ronald McDonald Houses collect pop tabs instead of entire aluminum cans because the tabs are pure high-quality aluminum, unlike cans, which consist of aluminum and other alloys. Tabs are also easier to store than whole cans. The final drop off of the collected tabs will be taking place at the Western Provincial Conference in San Diego, taking place March 7-9, 2008.

Additionally, the annual "Make a Difference, Make a Drop" was a repeated success at the past 2007 LEAD school in San Jose, CA. The Western Province raised over \$200 to support the victims of the California fires.
