Report of the Desert Mountain Regional Vice President

SUMMARY

The Desert Mountain Region experienced a successful Fall semester and is on track to accomplish many of its goals for the 2018-2019 year. I was able to visit multiple chapters over the course of the semester and meet their current leadership teams.

I was able to appoint District Directors at all six chapters and have had the chance to personally meet with each of them (some multiple times). I am proud to say that 5 out of 6 of my DD's attended LEAD in Albuquerque and participated in our Regional Meeting.

The Region is doing a much better job at communicating through their DD's rather than around them. I feel like we are working smarter as a Region rather than harder. In continuation from last year, each month my "RVP Report" is sent to District Directors and Presidents with important information and deadlines for the month ahead.

The region sent a total of 71 attendees to Albuquerque Fall LEAD school and is aiming to send at least 5 collegians from each chapter to the Western Provincial Conference, with one chapter already having 13 brothers registered!

The leadership team will work hard to promote GCC attendance, with a goal of each chapter sending at least 4 brothers.

All six chapters remain eligible to be Accredited level or higher in CMP. They also remain eligible to achieve my goal of advancing by at least one CMP rank compared to the previous year.

I am proud to report that five out of six chapters nominated COY nominees this fall. All five nominees submitted applications on time, giving the Desert Mountain Region an 83% application rate.

A Regional Initiation will be held by Gamma Omega at Arizona State University in the Spring. I look forward to working with Gamma Omega to plan another great initiation for the brothers across the region.

I believe in the growing potential of this region and look forward to working with the leadership to achieve our goals.

 - Status All chapters that are eligible for CMP Recognition this year are on track to reach at least Accredited Status. All current data shows that the above goal is also on track to be reached. This would give the Region multiple chapters of Excellence and Recognition.
- 2. All chapters hold at least one risk management event each semester.
 - Status Each chapter reached this goal in the Fall, although some chapters will not be submitting their Risk Management CMP Requirement until Spring.

- 3. All chapters hold at least one retreat/officer day to discuss chapter goals.
 - Status Four out of six schools met this goal in the Fall, and I am hoping for the other two to do so this Spring. I will be attending a retreat for Zeta Omega on 1/19/19.
- 4. All chapters pay dues in full, on time, to Central Office.
 - Status This was improved from last year, with only one small mistake that was quickly made right.
- 5. All chapters submit at least two award applications
 - Status I am seeing increased competition in the region this year, which should show in award applications received. This goal is on track to be met.

Host a "Spring Training" event for current and aspiring collegiate chapter and future alumni volunteer leaders in the region	In place of the officer training we have done in previous years, we have elected to focus more on those who are <i>interested</i> in perpetuating not only the fraternity but also becoming leaders in any capacity. Instead of focusing the conversations on the "how to", we want to focus on the "why" and discuss broader topics such as our Strategic Priorities and long-term goals/plans for our region.
	The event is planned for 3/23 at Chapman University.
Collect feedback from chapter members anonymously twice a year.	At the end of the fall term, we have collected anonymous feedback from an online form sent to all chapters. We plan to collect to feedback again towards the end of the spring term.
Rebranding of annual regional competitive athletic event	After some discussion, it was decided to rebrand our region's annual competitive athletic event from the more generic "Brotherhood Games" to the "Pacific Coast Cup", at times shortened to "Pac Coast Cup". The event is currently planned for 2/17 and both the planning of the event itself and rebranding are both current underway.

AWARDS COMMITTEE

The Sierra Nevada Regional Awards Committee for the 2018-2019 fiscal year is composed of 8 alumni brothers from all around the region to ensure a fair and balanced committee to decide on quality applications to send to the provincial and possible national level. The committee's first order of business was to decide the Collegian of the Year (COY) for the Sierra Nevada region. 5 out of 7 chapter COY nominations submitted a completed application to the committee. The committee has decided on a regional winner which will be announced at the LEAD Provincial Conference in Irvine, CA on February 16, 2019.

One of my goals for the next semester is to encourage draft applications to be sent to the committee for review and feedback. This will provide chapters with constructive feedback, increasing the quality of the application before the official submission by the June 1, 2019 deadline.

CHAPTER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (CMP)

6 out of the 7 collegiate chapters are on track to achieve the Accredited level of CMP for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. As a region, we will continue to encourage all chapters with their CMP submissions to achieve the Accredited level, as well as both the Recognition and Excellence levels. 6 out of 7 chapters are on track for achieving the Recognition and Excellence higher levels. The goal for 2018-2019 fiscal year, is to increase the number of chapters achieving those higher CMP tiers by providing consistent and constant communication regarding an upcoming deadlines through monthly CMP progress reports and newsletters.

EXPANSION

Not currently focusing on expansion efforts. However, potential expansion within the Sierra Nevada region are the following universities: (1) California State University, Stanislaus, (2) California State University, Bakersfield, and (3) University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

DISCIPLINE AND ASSISTANCE ACTIONS AND ISSUES

There were 2 cases of disciplinary issues that were dealt with during the Fall 2018 semester.

The first issue was with the Delta Pi Chapter at the University of Nevada, Reno regarding hazing allegations that occurred during the Spring 2017 semester. During the university investigation, the chapter was required to suspend all organizational activities, including the pledge process, which lasted around 2-3 weeks. After full compliance, the university's Office of Student Conduct has decided not to charge the chapter with any violation due to the timing and chapter correction. The investigation has revealed that the chapter has made strides in removing members who were involved in hazing activities and has removed pledge activities that could easily be misused and converted into hazing opportunities. No disciplinary action was taken.

The second issue was with the Epsilon Phi Chapter at the California State University, Sacramento regarding allegations during the Fall 2018 semester. The university's Student Organization & Leadership conducted an investigation, which lasted about 1 month. The chapter was required to suspend all organizational activities, including the pledge



process. The university allowed the national leadership to conduct an initiation of the new members. The investigation has revealed unapproved pledge activities outside the scope of the pledge program. Because the chapter recently taken off probation at the conclusion of Fall 2017, the university and the National Fraternity has decided to de-recognize and suspend the chapter effective immediately until December 31, 2019. The chapter can secure recognition for Spring 2020 by submitting an official letter of request for recognition.

SUMMARY

The South Pacific Region continues to improve and work hard, resulting in a strong start for the 2018-2019 year.
